## Picture Dictionary

Use all your spelling words to make your own dictionary. Include sections for each letter, even if that letter doesn't have any spelling words, and include a picture and definition for each spelling word. Be neat and creative and make sure to include all of your spelling words

## Friendly Letter

Write a friendly letter to your best friend using your spelling words. You may write one letter using all your spelling words, as long as your letter makes sense. You may also write multiple friendly letters until all of your spelling words have been used

## Comic Strip Spelling

Use your spelling words to write and illustrate a comic strip. You may use all your spelling words in one comic strip or you may write and illustrate multiple comic strips until all your spelling words have been used.

## Superhero Spelling

Use youn spelling words to write letters to your favorite superhero! You can write one letter using all of your words, as long as your letter makes sense. Or you can write multiple letters using some of your words until you have used all of your spelling words in a superhero letter
